What Does The Fund Invest In?

The Fund's investment objective is to provide regular current income by investing globally in companies with either direct or indirect exposure to infrastructure.

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How risky Is It?

The value of the Fund can go down as well as up. You could lose money.

One way to gauge risk is to look at how much a fund's returns change over time. This is called "volatility".

In general, funds with higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. Funds with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

Risk rating

Starlight Capital has rated the volatility of this Fund as **medium**.

This rating considers how much the Fund's returns have changed from year to year. It doesn't tell you how volatile the Fund will be in the future. The rating can change over time. A fund with a low risk rating can still lose money.

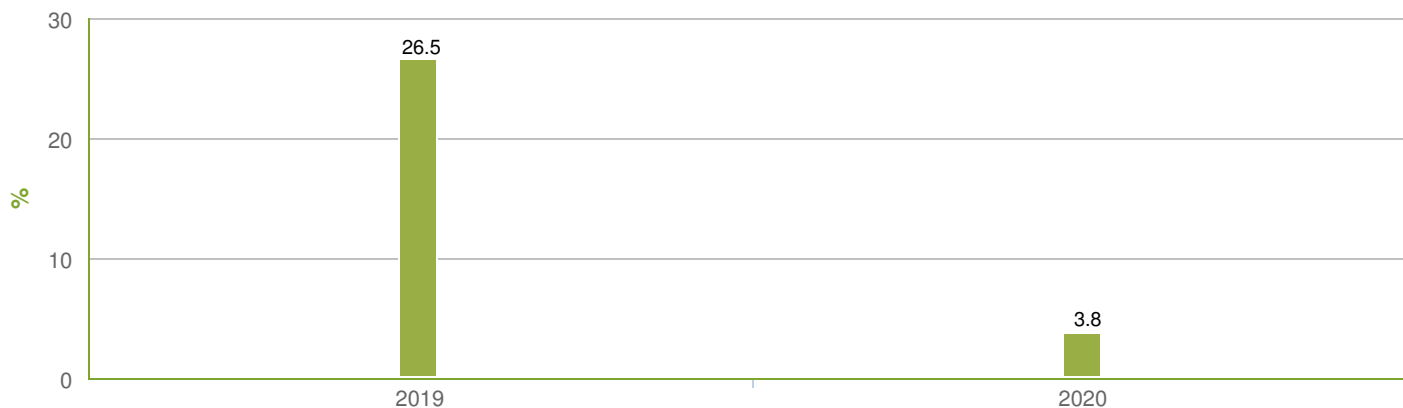
Like most mutual funds, this Fund doesn't have any guarantees. You may not get back the money you invest.

How Has The Fund Performed?

This section tells you how Series F units of the Fund have performed over the past 2 years. Returns are after expenses have been deducted. These expenses reduce the Fund's returns.

Year-by-year returns

This chart shows how Series F units of the Fund performed in each of the past 2 years. The Fund did not drop in value in any of the 2 years. The range of returns and change from year to year can help you assess how risky the Fund has been in the past. It does not tell you how the Fund will perform in the future.



Best and worst 3-month returns

This table shows the best and worst returns for Series F units of the Fund in a 3-month period since inception. The best and worst 3-month returns could be higher or lower in the future. Consider how much of a loss you could afford to take in a short period of time.

	Return	3 months ending	If you invested \$1,000 at the beginning of the period
Best return	14.3%	March 29, 2019	Your investment would rise to \$1,143
Worst return	-13.1%	March 31, 2020	Your investment would drop to \$869

Average return

A person who invested \$1,000 in Series F units of the Fund on the series' start date would have had \$1,330 as of September 30, 2021. This works out to an annual compound return of 10.0%.

Who is this fund for?

Investors who:

- are seeking a balance of current income and the potential for long-term capital appreciation,
- are seeking to add global hard asset diversification to your investment portfolio,
- are not concerned with short-term price fluctuations,
- are willing to accept a medium degree of risk, and
- are planning to hold your investment for the long term.



This series is generally only available to you if you have a fee-based account with your representative's firm.

A word about tax

In general, you'll have to pay income tax on any money you make on a fund. How much you pay depends on the tax laws where you live and whether or not you hold the Fund in a registered plan such as a Registered Retirement Savings Plan, or a Tax-Free Savings Account. Keep in mind that if you hold your fund in a non-registered account, fund distributions are included in your taxable income, whether you get them in cash or have them reinvested.



How much does it cost?

This section shows the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own and sell Series F units of the Fund. The fees and expenses - including any commissions - can vary among series of a fund and among funds. Higher commissions can influence representatives to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other funds and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

1. Sales charges

No sales charge is paid when you own Series F units of the Fund.

2. Fund expenses

You don't pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the series' returns.

As of March 31, 2021, the expenses of Series F units of the Fund were 1.57% of its value. This equals \$15.70 for every \$1,000 invested.

Management expense ratio (MER) This is the total of the series' management fee and operating expenses (including fixed administration fees)	1.30%
Trading expense ratio (TER) These are the Fund's trading costs.	0.27%

More about the trailing commission

No trailing commission is paid to your representative's firm when you own Series F units of the Fund.

3. Other fees

You may have to pay other fees when you buy, hold, sell or switch units of the Fund.

Fee	What you pay
Short-term trading fee	If you sell or switch units within 30 days of purchase, you could pay a fee of 1.00% of the value of the units you sell or switch. If we detect a pattern of excessive short-term trading, you could pay a fee of up to 2.00% of the value of units you purchase, sell or switch within a 90-day period. This fee goes to the Fund.
Switch fee	Your representative's firm may charge you up to 2.00% of the value of units you switch to another mutual fund managed by Starlight Capital. There is no fee payable to Starlight Capital for any switches of units.
NSF cheque fee	We will charge you \$30 if a payment for a purchase of units is returned by your bank for any reason.
Fee-based account fee	Generally, you must participate in an eligible fee-based or wrap program with your representative's firm to purchase this series. Your representative's firm may charge you a fee, which is negotiated between you and your representative's firm and paid directly to them.

What if I change my mind?

Under the securities law in some provinces and territories, you have the right to:

- withdraw from an agreement to buy mutual fund units within two business days after you receive a simplified prospectus or Fund Facts document, or
- cancel your purchase within 48 hours after you receive confirmation of the purchase.

In some provinces and territories, you will also have the right to cancel a purchase, or in some jurisdictions, claim damages, if the simplified prospectus, annual information form, Fund Facts document or financial statements contain a misrepresentation. You must act within the time limit set by the securities law in your province or territory.
